CSDE 502 Population Studies Proseminar I (1 Credit) Fall 2003

Population studies is an interdisciplinary endeavor and CSDE's strength is in the diversity of its affiliate members and departments. There are active faculty from over eight departments and schools including Sociology, Anthropology, Geography, Economics, Statistics, Social Work, Public Affairs, and Urban Planning. This course is an attempt to expose students to the breadth and depth of expertise within CSDE. Each week staff or faculty will visit the class to discuss aspects of their research and expertise.

For the faculty discussions in weeks 4 through 11 there will be one or two readings available beforehand from visiting faculty. I expect students to read these before class and contribute to discussion.

The course is evaluated as credit/no credit. Active engagement and discussion are required for a grade of credit.
