

Summer Course on Refugee Issues

Toronto, June 11 – 19, 2005

The Summer Course at the Centre for Refugee Studies offers postgraduate training in refugee issues for up to seventy practitioners inside and outside government who work on some aspect of refugee protection or assistance. The course includes panel discussions, case studies, a simulation exercise, and lectures conducted by local and international experts in the field. A York University / Centre for Refugee Studies Certificate is awarded upon successful completion of the eight-day program.
