Aim and Scope

The LGBTQ+ community is facing fast-changing societal conditions. Legal recognition as well as medical advancements in e.g. reproductive technology have broadened the opportunities for a wide range of life choices for LGBTQ+ identified individuals. We invite paper submissions within all social sciences, focusing on life-changing transitions in the LGBTQ+ community. The aim is to bring together researchers using quantitative as well as qualitative methods to present cutting edge research on the LGBTQ+ community. We also aim for a discussion on the limitations and possibilities of these methods. In addition, two keynote speakers will give an overview of their selected topics:

Christopher (Kitt) Carpenter is a Professor of Economics at Vanderbilt University and the director of the Vanderbilt LGBT Policy Lab. His research focuses on the effects of public policies on health and family outcomes.

Anna Malmquist is an Associate Professor of Psychology at Linköping University. Her research is focused on families beyond heteronormativity, and she has published many papers based on interviews with the LGBTQ community.

The workshop starts at lunch on Thursday, September 23, and extends to the afternoon of Friday, September 24. Given the ongoing pandemic, we plan for a hybrid of online and in-person participation. Every presenter will be assigned a discussant.

Accommodation will be reserved in downtown Stockholm for all who wish to attend in-person. The workshop will cover two nights of accommodations and reimburse economy class travel costs for presenting authors and discussants.
