Duties and Requirements:

We seek **two (2)** graduate research assistants to support a systematic literature review of climate change maladaptation scholarship. This research will occur under the direction and supervision of Professors Sameer Shah and Celina Balderas Guzmán. The duties of the research assistants will primarily include closely reading and coding academic peer-reviewed articles. Each student RA will read and analyze multiple articles per week. Successful candidates will have:

- A broad understanding of climate change and adaptation and an interest in equity, justice, and sustainability concerns;
- Familiarity with Qualtrics software (preferred but not required);
- Demonstrated abilities to read and synthesize large volumes of interdisciplinary, academic literature; and
- Demonstrated abilities to work as part of a research team.

Project Background:

Adaptation activities are essential for reducing climate-related risks on people, property, livelihoods, ecosystems, and infrastructure. Yet an increasing body of research finds that climate adaptation is not inherently positive and can, in fact, increase or re-distribute risks within and across societies – a phenomenon known as "maladaptation". Although studies increasingly document maladaptation, no systematic assessments of the climate maladaptation concept, methods, and empirics has been conducted. A deeper understanding of the key gaps, strengths, and limitations will help identify and advance further research on the most salient and applied questions, including for example, how policymakers, researchers, and communities can develop effective and just adaptation policy, anticipate negative externalities before they occur, and even reverse adaptation activities that adversely affect residents and communities, including marginalized groups.

Pay: Salaried ASE positions are 50% FTE (20 hrs/week) and commensurate with academic standing, per the ASE contract.
